I've lived in The Pointe Community since 1979. I am one of the original homeowners. We put our names on our lot in 1977.



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Community Bulk Trash Pick-up

Please have items at the curb prior to this time, but no more than 5 days before pick-up. Any hazardous materials should be placed separately and to the side of the bulk items. Monsoon Season

Soon the Monsoons will bring welcome rains and relief from the summer heat. The thunderstorms bring their own hazards. There are a few things you can do to ensure your safety.

- Remember to check the weather forecast before leaving home for extended periods of time. You can always check your weather app for updates or keep a NOAA Weather Radio or AM/FM radio with you or a cell phone capable of browsing the web.
- Severe thunderstorms can develop quickly. When a warning has been issued, outdoor activities should be postponed.
- Either secure loose outdoor furniture and garbage cans, or move them indoors and close patio umbrellas.
- Never leave pets outside during monsoon season. You never know when a thunderstorm or a windstorm might unexpectedly occur.
- Stay away from trees and downed power lines. Never touch a downed power line, even if it appears dead.
- During a storm, stay away from windows.
- Do not go in the pool during a storm.

Architectural Applications

Per your community documents, always notify the management company prior to beginning any major repair or replacement. Complete and submit an https://example.com/Architectural/Landscape Change Form prior to beginning any exterior work involving a change, and always notify the management company prior to doing any general maintenance and/or repair work. To learn more about the approval process, please review the architectural documents and guidelines under Community_Documents.

If you are planning on making repairs or doing demolishing that requires the use of a temporary trailer, you must notify the management company prior to the delivery of the trailer.

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Community Reminders

Trash pick-up: Monday and Thursday mornings between 2:00-4:00am. Do not place your trash at the curb of the building you reside in until at least 6:00pm the night before. There is a dumpster you can use at any time in Lot C. However – the dumpster is not for bulk trash. Break down boxes before using the dumpster. Don't place trash on ground next to it. No construction materials. No commercial dumping. Violators will be fined.

Recycle pick-up: Wednesday mornings between 2:00-4:00am. Recyclable items include: cardboard, paper, plastic, glass and small cans. All containers must be washed out and clean before putting in the recycle bin. Unclean containers contaminate and leak, destroying any chance that anything in the bin can be recycled. *Also, do not bag your recyclables. If recyclables are bagged, the recycling company throws it in with garbage.

Pet Friendly Community: Dogs must be on leash. Use bags to pick up your pet's waste, and place in trash container. We have two locations for free waste bags, Belmont Ave and Frier – at the green space. The second is on Dreamy Draw Drive between Desert Park and Augusta Avenues. There are also free waste bags and trash receptacles located next to the Hotel on Belmont and on Dreamy Draw at the entrance to the hiking trails.

Pool area: No smoking, glass or pets in the pool area. Food shall be eaten at the designated tables NOT inside the pool. Please accompany your guests to the pool. Per our pool rules, limit the number of your guests to four people. Owners and residents are responsible for guests' behavior. Given the new pool upgrades and increased usage, the pool is a popular place. Please respect residents' access to the pool first. Thank you for your cooperation.

- You can also pay by credit card or echeck by logging on to <u>www.WeArevision.com</u>. Keep your statement handy, because you will be asked to put in your account number.
