


Spring is here!

Rules Committee Update

Protecting property values and the peaceful enjoyment of our homes is a key role of the Home Owner Association. The HOA carries out that role through the recorded Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions and the Board-adopted rules.

This year, the HOA Board tasked the committee with looking at a number of rules, in addition to more closely looking at the rules in general, we'll be considering parking, rule fines and enforcement, and look at some of the boilerplate language in our communications.

If parking issues are nibbling at your annoyance meter, contact Dennece, Jennifer or Eric and help us define the problem. Parking issues, early observation suggests, may be limited to the Courthome area of the community, and the Committee needs to know if parking is an issue elsewhere as well.

The Pointe's deed covenants, updated last November, and its Association Rules intend to provide equitable and understandable standards applied throughout the community. The Committee can be most responsive if community volunteers join the three HOA Board members. We meet for an hour about once a month, sometimes twice, at the Hole In The Wall or the poolside cabana. What the poop?

Spring is in the air, and the dog count again outnumbers the people in the Pointe. It's one of the best features of living here when your dog socializes with other pups while you chat with your neighbors. The whole thing goes sour because a few inconsiderate dog owners neglect to pick up their dog's feces from private property and common areas. There are examples of this problem all over the community.

Right now, there are five places to grab a bag for the waste if you've left home without one. Surely your dog will enjoy the extra thousand feet you might have to walk to get one.

When dog poop is left, someone must clean it up – and that person is usually a more responsible dog owner. If you're a property owner with renters, ensure that they know it's not only unsanitary and inconsiderate to leave dog waste, it's also a city-fineable offense. On the common area, it's an extra cost to the community because the landscape company charges when they do your dirty work.

It takes 39 seconds to pick up dog waste. If you don't want to carry it home, there are waste cans about 250 feet north of the Winter Drive-Dreamy Draw Road intersection, another at the trail up the hill by Frier Drive and Dreamy Draw Road, and one at the stop sign at Frier Drive and 18th Street.

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Community Reminders

Trash pick-up: Monday and Thursday early in the morning. Do not place your trash at the curb of the building you reside in until at least 6:00pm the night before. **No bulk items** such as mattresses, damaged patio furniture, etc., are allowed to be placed out as trash.

Bulk pick-up can be arranged by individual owners, at owner's expense, directly with Family Pride Sanitation (602-740-3543).

Recycle pick-up: Wednesday mornings between 2:00-4:00am. Recyclable items include: cardboard, paper, plastic, glass and small cans. All containers must be washed out and clean before putting in the recycle bin. Unclean containers contaminate and leak, destroying any chance that anything in the bin can be recycled. *Also, do not bag your recyclables. If recyclables are bagged, the recycling company throws it in with garbage.

Pet Friendly Community: Dogs must be on leash. Use bags to pick up your pet's waste, and place in trash container. We have two locations for free waste bags, Belmont Ave and Frier – at the green space. The second is on Dreamy Draw Drive between Desert Park and Augusta Avenues. There are also free waste bags and trash receptacles located next to the Hotel on Belmont and on Dreamy Draw at the entrance to the hiking trails. Please be considerate and do not to leave your dog outside-daytime or evening-if he/she is continually barking.

Pool area: No smoking, glass or pets in the pool area. Food and drink are to be consumed at the designated tables NOT inside the pool. Please accompany your guests to the pool. Per our pool rules, limit the number of your guests to four people. Owners and residents are responsible for guests' behavior. Given the new pool upgrades and increased usage, the pool is a popular place. Please respect residents' access to the pool first. Thank you for your cooperation.
