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# COMMUNITY BLOCK WALLS

We are working our way through the community inspecting the common area walls to check for any repairs that might need to be made. The walls are aging and we are seeing more wear and tear on them. Please make sure you not over watering and causing damage to the joint common area walls.

Also, we cannot have anyone backwashing their pools into the common areas. This causes damage to the walls and the landscaping which increases the HOA's cost to repair.

<u>Please note, any joint common area wall repair that is completed and the damage</u> has been identified as coming from the inside of the wall each owner will be charged back at 50% of the repair.

Sustainable Landscape Management – Seasonal Pruning

#### **Plant Rejuvenation**

Trimming back or cutting back Yellow Bells (Tecoma stans), also known as Arizona Yellow Bells, is necessary for several reasons:

- 1. Encouraging Bushy Growth: Pruning encourages the plant to grow more densely, resulting in a fuller appearance.
- 2. Shape Control: Trimming helps maintain a desired shape or form, preventing the plant from becoming too leggy or unruly.
- 3. Removing Dead or Diseased Branches: Cutting back allows for the removal of dead, damaged, or diseased branches, promoting overall plant health.
- 4. Promoting Flowering: Pruning can stimulate new growth, which may lead to increased flower production.
- 5. Preventing Overgrowth: Yellow Bells can become invasive if not properly maintained, so cutting back helps control its spread.
- 6. Enhancing Aesthetics: Regular pruning can improve the overall appearance of the plant and the landscape.
