1. Anacacho Orchid (Bauhinia lunarioides) - 12-15 ft tall with equal or less spread
2. Cascalote (Tara cacalaco) - 15-20 ft tall with equal spread (Note: "Smoothie" is thornless)
3. Chaste tree (Vitex agnus-castus) - 15-20 ft tall with equal
4. Chitalpa (Chitalpa tashkentensis) - 20-30 ft (more water $=$ taller) tall with equal or greater spread
5. Chinese Evergreen Pear (Pyrus kawakammi) - 25-30 ft tall with equal spread
6. Citrus (Citrus sp.) - 15-20 ft tall with equal spread (Note: back yard only)
7. Desert Willow (Chilopsis linearis) $-15-35 \mathrm{ft}$ tall (more water $=$ taller) with equal or greater spread
8. Evergreen Elm (Ulmus parvifolia) - 35 ft tall with equal spread
9. Fruitless Olive (Olea europaea 'Swan Hill') - 25-30 ft tall with equal spread
10. Hop Bush (Dodonaea viscosa) - 15-20 ft tall with less than equal spread
11. Ironwood (Olneya tesota) - 25 ft tall with equal spread
12. Bay Laurel or Sweet Bay (Laurus nobilis) - 20-40 ft tall with $15-30 \mathrm{ft}$ spread.
13. Leather-leaf Acacia (Acacia craspedocarpa) - 12-15 ft tall with equal spread
14. Mastic (Pistacia lentiscus) - 25 ft tall with equal spread
15. Mulga (Acacia Aneura) - 20-25 ft tall with equal or lesser spread
16. Ocotillo (Fouquieria splendens) - can reach heights of up to 20 feet.
17. Palo Blanco (Acacia willardiana) - 20 ft tall with equal or less spread
18. Purple leaf plum (Prunus cearasifer) - 20-25 ft tall with less than equal spread
19. Red Push Pistache (Pistacia $x$ 'Red Push') - 30-40 ft tall with equal spread
20. Snail seed (Cocculus laurifolius) - 10-25 ft with equal spread
21. Texas Mountain Laurel (Sophora secundiflora) - 10-25 ft tall with equal spread
22. Texas Olive (Cordia boissieri) - 15-20 ft with equal spread
23. Twisted acacia (Acacia schaffneri) - 20-25 ft tall with 25-30 ft spread
24. Weeping Pittosporum (Pittosporum augustifolium) - 23-30 ft tall with 10-15 ft spread
25. Yellow Bell or Yellow Oleander (Cascabela thevetia) - 10-15ft tall with equal spread
