Flood Irrigation in Silverstone Ranch

It's a familiar sight in and around Silverstone Ranch; some yards flooded with irrigation water. This water <u>traveled over 150</u> <u>miles</u> through mountains, rivers, streams, dams, canals, and pipelines to end up here.

Why do some yards have <u>irrigation</u> while others don't? To understand the answer to this question, we need to go back more than a 100 years ago to the <u>early 1900s</u>.

In the Wild West days of the Valley, the population was booming and water was hard to come by. The <u>National Reclamation</u> <u>Act of 1902</u> presented an opportunity to secure the Valley's water future. In 1903, a group of Valley residents formed the <u>Salt</u> <u>River Valley Water Users Association</u>. Their pledge of over 200,000 acres of land allowed the Salt River Project (SRP) to become <u>one of the first five reclamation projects in the United States</u>.

To secure government funds to build and maintain the <u>Roosevelt Dam</u> and canal system, members of the water users association pledged their land as collateral. In return, their land secured rights to shares of the desert's most precious resource: Water.

Today, the parcels of land are split up, but the rights to the water shares remain with the land. If you own one of the twelve (12) Equestrian Lots on the west side of the Association with these irrigation water rights, your land was part of a historic effort to secure reliable water resources for the Valley's water future.

Benefits: Today, irrigation retains the beauty and legacy of neighborhoods throughout the Valley. Benefits include:

- Ease of sustaining lush vegetation: Irrigated land benefits from deep soaks that allow large trees and vegetation to thrive,
- Cost-effectiveness,
- Reliable flood irrigation on a schedule,
- An opportunity to work together with your neighbors.
