# Travel Trailers, Toy Hauler, Boat Storage - Allowance

**Change**: Allow Travel Trailers, Toy Haulers, Boats to be stored on Property (any recreational vehicle which cannot be self-driven)

Guidelines: Allow for One (1) Either RV or Boat may be parked/stored in side yard of property.

#### Terms:

### **RV** = Recreational Vehicle

RV storage on property will be allowed if the following conditions are met:

- 1. The RV is **not** self-driven, meaning it **MUST** be towed behind a vehicle.
- 2. The RV is maintained and is visibly in good condition from any side or neighboring property.
- 3. The RV is stored behind a gate on the property and gate can be closed allowing a maximum of 6ft to be visible above wall/gate.
- 4. While stored on property the RV cannot be occupied or "lived" in.
- 5. Must be parked parallel to home in side yard only.
- 6. Cannot be stored in Driveway (Must be stored behind closed gate)
- 7. RV must be registered with property management company prior to storage on property
  - a. Make, Model, Color
  - b. Picture Submitted with registration
- 8. If covered, cover must be kept in "like new" condition, cannot be in any disrepair.
  - a. Cover must be "MADE" for a Boat or RV, Tarps not allowed, only cloth type of cover will be allowed.

## Allowed:

- Pop-up trailers
- Travel Trailers
- Toy hauler (Travel Trailer type)
- Bay Boats
- Bowrider Boats
- Bass Boats
- Dual Pontoon

### Not Allowed:

- Fifth Wheel
- Class A RVs
- Class B RVs
- Class C RVs
- Center Console Boats
- Dual Console Boats
- Sail Boats
- Yachts

- Tri-Toon Pontoon

## **Unlisted Type:**

- Requires submission to board for approval prior to being stored

## **Current standards:**

- RV's may be parked on road in front of home for limited duration with communication(email) to Property management company (limited to 7 days consecutive time)
- Cannot be parked in front of Fire access
- Must be properly maintained.
- Cannot Empty Tanks (Fresh, Grey, or Black) while on property.
